Learnings

Things we are looking to improve on...

- Ensuring there is always a clear roadmap in place for the work the Graduate(s) will be doing and ensuring there is plenty of 1-to-1 support to openly talk through work, projects, wellbeing, life, etc.
- Tailoring work to the individual Graduate(s) needs/skillset/aspirations, especially as there are different motivations and different levels of initiative/knowledge depending on the individuals.

 Putting in place a good support system helps ensure graduates have all the information and pointers they need for navigating a new workplace and structure as complex as a territorial authority (or any large organisation). This also provides an opportunity for growing the mentoring skills of existing staff.
