**RECYCLING YOUR FOOD
SCRAPS IS SIMPLE**

- 1** To help keep your kitchen tidy, clean, and save time, make compost or an Auckland Council compostable bin liner.
- 2** All food scraps can be recycled including bones, meat, dairy, bread and fruit pulp. Put them in your kitchen caddy during the week.
- 3** The bin liner should roll along with your food scraps. Empty the caddy into your food scrap collection bin weekly during the week if it's getting dirty.
- 4** Put your food scraps outside for up to 48 hours before putting them in your weekly household bin, leave space between items.
