



Waste trucks	56	71	79%
Waste facilities	34	51	67%

#### Unique accreditation model with general & sector specific obligations



















Accreditation begins with the Battery Stewardship Commitment and the Drop off point Code of Practice.

- Obligations are specific to the role in the battery supply chain.
- + Secures funding, enables education, improves safety and delivers transparency across the battery lifecycle,
- Independent audits used to verify conformance and give assurance of minerals recovery from used batteries.




Battery Collections in 2023

AU vs EU Year 1 Collection rate




Collection Rate (Year 2)














# What are the obstacles for consumers using B-cycle?

# **B-cycle collections by the numbers**


Weight of batteries collected by jurisdiction 2022 vs 2023 (tonnes)





### Scheme review

B-cycle model is under review to ensure the model provides suitable financial and other arrangements to ensure success

- Meet our expectations for success
- Adapt to fluctuations in the economic environment
- Respond to the changed risk profile of batteries

#### Scheme Review: Challenges with the current model

Scheme design based on economics prior to launch & changes are subject to re-authorisation

Free riding and cost of living pressures are impacting levy revenue

Reduced market or reduced market share of participants

Significant increase in costs for collection & recycling activities

Risk mitigation Consumer Price Index has increased 16.8% since 2019 Commodity prices have dropped

Price of lithium derived black mass has dropped over 62% from \$12,000 to \$4,500 per tonne

#### The proposal

#### **Modulated Levies**

- Focused on risk mitigation
  - + Button batteries
  - + Alkaline batteries
  - + Lithium batteries
  - + Problematic chemistries
- Annual levy adjustment to accommodate variabilities
  - + Different chemistry risk level
  - + Collection targets
  - + Changing costs of service delivery

#### Modulated rebates

- Annual adjustment based on variations in publicly available market indices:
  - + Consumer Price Index
  - + Commodity prices
- Modulated collection & recycling rebates
  - +Alkaline/Carbon Zinc/NiMH
  - +Lithium-ion/BB's/NiCd
  - +Li-Prim/LFP
  - +Other?





#### Regulatory reform to support scheme review





- 1. Establish **import controls** on battery quality, repair & replaceability, and online sales.
- 2. Support stewardship industry development and circular economy through policy, risk mitigation, investment & procurement action.
- 3. Regulate participation e.g. Battery Rule under the RaWR Act.
  - + Importers required to participate in an accreditation scheme (defined in BSC Issues Paper).
  - + Inform liable parties of their obligation to participate in the accredited scheme.
  - + Hold scheme accountable for achieving agreed outcomes.

- 1. Confirm scope in consultation with industry & government.
- 2. 5-year stewardship plan defining actions to address market failures, funding mechanism(s) and KPIs in consultation with industry & government.
- 3. Define **governance arrangements**: obligations & legal standing (ACCC authorisation).
- 4. Implement the plan in a safe & transparent manner across the life cycle of the battery
- 5. Public annually reporting on stewardship outcomes and performance measures.
- 6. Independent verification of Scheme outcomes: third party audits and accountability to government and consumers.


