The problem of dealing with escaped EPS



The Litter Act refers to depositing waste which works for illegal dumping situations.

EPS is often regarded as inert

There's evidence that it can cause changes to the physical, chemical or biological condition of soil and water.

Escaped EPS is almost impossible to pick up



What is a contaminant?

Likely to change the physical, chemical, or biological condition or land, air or water
