ANGUS WHITE

Ministry for the Environment

Resource Management Reform - the big picture

TUESDAY 23 | 9.30-10.30

Angus has been a manager in the Resource Management Reform Programme at the Ministry since January 2020. He helped advise and support the RM Review Panel and is supporting the current reform programme.

Angus joined MfE from the Treasury where he worked in the commercial performance team advising on the global settlement between the Crown and Christchurch City Council post the 2010-II earthquake sequence and on the performance of, and Crown's ownership interest in, NZ Post, MetService, Ōtākaro, Quotable value, and Lotto.

In prior stints at the Treasury, Angus worked on economic strategy, infrastructure, and budget matters and spent almost three years in the Minister for State Owned Enterprises' office.

Angus was also a manager for three years at economic consulting company Castalia Advisors where he advised on infrastructure investment, competition and regulation, and policy matters.

HON DAVID PARKER

Minister for the Environment

Hon David Parker is a Labour List MP, Attorney-General, Minister for the Environment, Minister for Oceans and Fisheries, Minister of Revenue, Associate Minister of Finance.

Prior to politics, David was a litigation and managing partner in law firm Anderson Lloyd and was a cofounder of the Dunedin Community Law Centre. David is an experienced CEO and company director and involved in a number of start-up businesses in the agri-biotechnology field including A2 Milk, and BLIS Technologies which he managed from start-up to the main board of the NZX.

He held various Ministerial portfolios in the Helen Clark Labour-led Government including Attorney-General, Energy, Climate Change, Transport, Land Information and State Services. In 2008 he was named by the Listener magazine as Environmentalist of the Year for his work as Minister of Energy and Climate Change. He pioneered New Zealand's emissions trading scheme, then described by many as the most significant environmental reform in NZ for decades.

After the 2020 election, David was reappointed Attorney-General, Minister for the Environment and Associate Minister of Finance, as well as being appointed as Minister for Oceans and Fisheries, and Minister of Revenue.

David pursues policies which both enhance economic growth and address the growing extremes between rich and poor in New Zealand, while protecting the environment.

Climate Change Commission

How climate change policy will drive waste infrastructure in 2025 and beyond

Jo Hendy led the Secretariat of the Interim Climate Change Committee and oversaw the Committee's inquiry into renewable electricity. In her former role as Director of Research and Analysis for the Parliamentary Commissioner for the Environment, she led independent environmental investigations into issues including sea-level rise and agricultural greenhouse gas emissions. Jo also spent seven years working for Motu Economic and Public Policy Research. She holds a BSc (Hons) in Mathematics, and a Graduate Diploma in Applied Science (Meteorology).



SEAN SIMPSON

LanzaTech

There is no such thing as waste

WEDNESDAY 24 | 13.30-15.00

While renewable energy sources like wind, hydro and solar play an important part in reducing global carbon emissions, the world still - at this point - needs high-density transport fuels and materials, which require carbon. LanzaTech, which Dr Sean Simpson began in 2005, developed and commercialised a novel microbial technology to convert waste streams from industry, society and agriculture into fuel, that achieves a 75-90% greenhouse gas reduction compared to gasoline. The company has raised over US\$400 million in investment to develop this innovative technology, and has already opened a commercial plant in China. Alongside LanzaTech, Sean has supported numerous other New Zealand tech start-ups, including introducing Rocket Lab to their major investment funders, and personally investing in start-ups Avertana, and Dotteral, and technology incubator Level Two. Sean has over 20 publications and 200 patents to his name, and a host of awards, including the 2014 New Zealand Innovator of the Year Award, the 2015 US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Presidential Green Chemistry Award, the 2013 Kea NZ World Class New Zealander in Science Award, the 2013 Bio Spectrum Asia-Pacific Entrepreneur of the Year Award, and the 2011 NZBIO Young Biotechnologist of the Year.
